He served for 5 years as Administrator of HUD ONAP, responsible for the funding, oversight, and monitoring of the HUD ONAP American Indian and Alaska Native housing and related services for all of Alaska. He developed strategies to ensure that Federal government responsibilities are met in a timely manner for the review of grant applications, awarding of grant funds, monitoring of issued grants, and enforcement of problem grants. Previous positions held by Mr. Mundy since 1985 include Executive Director of the Bering Straits Regional Housing Authority, Real Estate Loan Manager for the Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union, Director of the Housing Management Department for the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation, and Deputy Director of the Alaska State Housing Authority.
